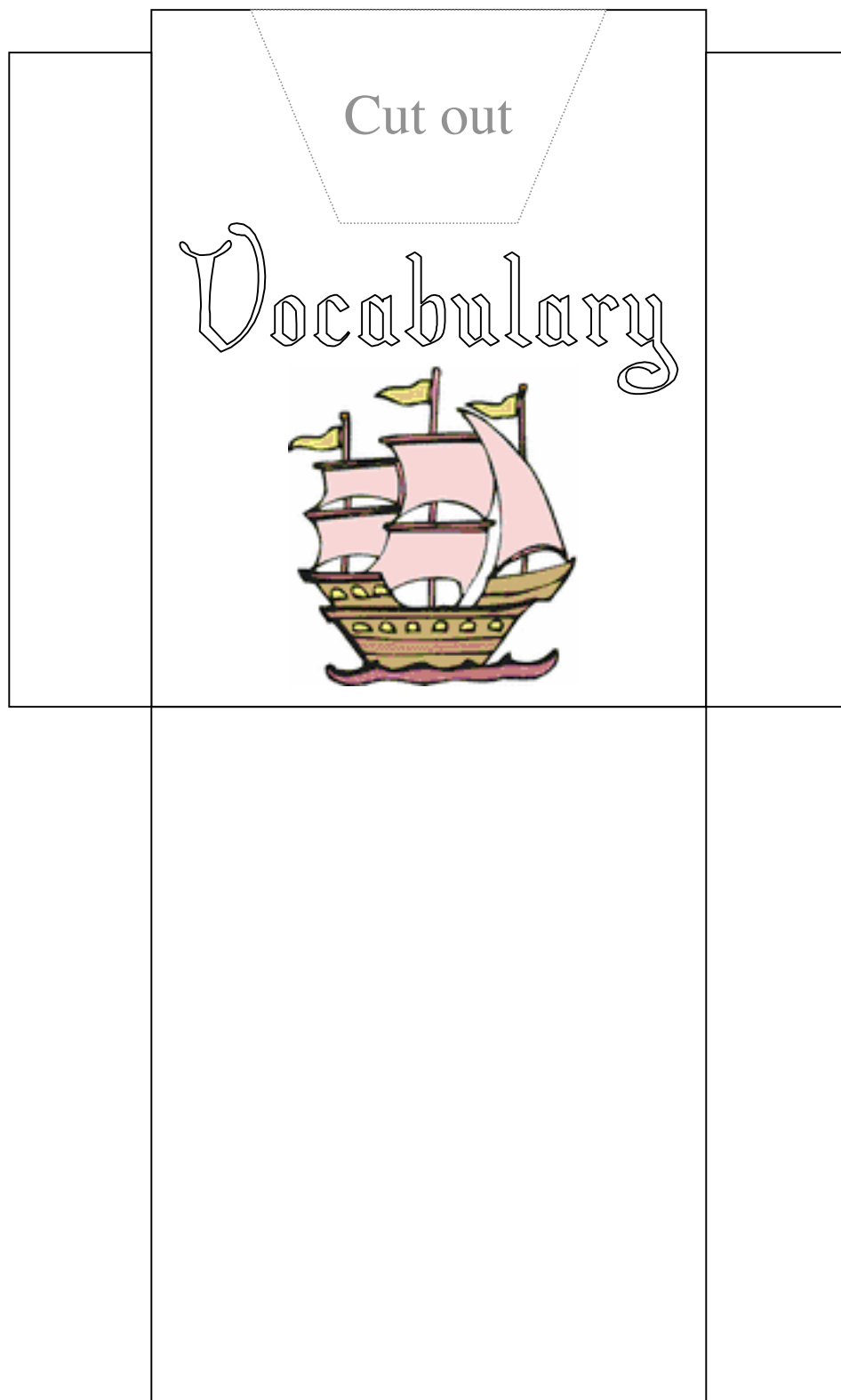

plunder	to rob especially openly and by force
rations	a food allowance for one day
mutiny	refusal to obey authority; <i>especially</i> : a military outbreak against the officer in charge
destination	a place which is the goal of a journey or to which something is sent
provisions	a stock of materials or supplies; <i>especially</i> : a stock of food
scurvy	a disease caused by lack of vitamin C and characterized by loosening of the teeth, softening of the gums, and bleeding under the skin
riptides	a small but strong channel of water moving out to sea
spoils	stolen goods
circumnavigate	to go completely around especially by water
expedition	a journey or trip undertaken for a specific purpose (as war or exploring)
commission	an order granting the power to perform various acts or duties
sanction	1 : an action taken to enforce a law or rule 2 : official permission or approval

galleon	a large sailing ship with square sails used from the 1400s to the 1700s especially by the Spanish
